The next day, Moody's sermon was about the Good Shepherd. As the sermon was coming to a close, Moody asked Sankey to sing something suitable for the invitation. Sankey thought of the words he had tucked away. Though no music had yet been written for it, he went to the organ and struck the chord of Aflat, and right there and then came up with a tune that remains unchanged to this day. A large number responded to the invitation.

The invitation presented was inviting Christians to commit to reaching the lost. What follows are some of the words that spoke to me recently during my devotional time:

There were ninety and nine that safely lay In the shelter of the fold; But one was out on the hills away, Far off from the gates of gold. Away on the mountains wild and bare; Away from the tender Shepherd's care.
